Random Musings from Pastor Barbara

Sometimes we do not realize all that it takes to keep thriving – doing what we do and offering what we can – inside our church and out in the community. Recently, a couple of dedicated lay people and several of our youth painted the nursery. Stop by and take a peek. It looks great and represents many hours and several hands! We were a strong presence at Open Streets the day before the eclipse with volunteers from church blessings bikes and sharing information about unusual recyclables. Right now it's power-washing our walks and buildings. Things like this happen all the time around here, inside and outside our walls.

This fall, if you are serious about our tenets – our shared understanding of what it means to follow Jesus – I am hoping you will prayerfully jump into ways to engage life through your heart, your mind and your actions. I share very candidly with you that some of what we offer now, or hope to offer through our church, could use more support from those of you who feel an affinity for certain kinds of ministry.

For instance, if we want to schedule any more fellowship or service events that involve food, we need a few more capable kitchen stewards. A kitchen steward is someone who is trained to supervise others in any of our kitchen spaces. No steward is expected to be responsible for an endless stream of events. In order to spread out this important work, more of you, who love to cook and are comfortable doing some supervision, are absolutely needed! If you enjoy working with children, Joyful Path, our Tuesday evening education hour, from 6:30-7:30, could use teachers and helpers on a rotating basis to engage our kids with a great curriculum. It teaches our progressive faith perspective through stories about Jesus and other wisdom sources. Perhaps you would like to be part of this team once a month. That small commitment would be immensely helpful to the continuity of this ministry.

A new program, Messy Church, is a once-a-month Saturday afternoon intergenerational experience of church – for kids with their parents or grandparents or neighbors. If you are crafty, or love to talk with children and adults, or you'd like to help make a simple meal happen, you are needed! Messy Church is space that serves as an outreach to kids and families who don't normally come to church. (For Joyful Path or Messy Church, contact Bev Park at congregational.life@corvallisfumc.org)

Many hands make light work when we have fun events like the Fall Feast Fundraiser on September 29. In hopes of closing the gap between our expected expenses and our income, this event needs several people to volunteer a little time in any number of ways. Again, you could contact Bev Park if you'd like to help.

Also coming this fall is a little shift in how we approach the financial health of our church. Don't be surprised by little stories and nuggets of information about who we are and what it takes to be church, being highlighted from mid-September through October.

Where and how will you be church this fall? You are needed.

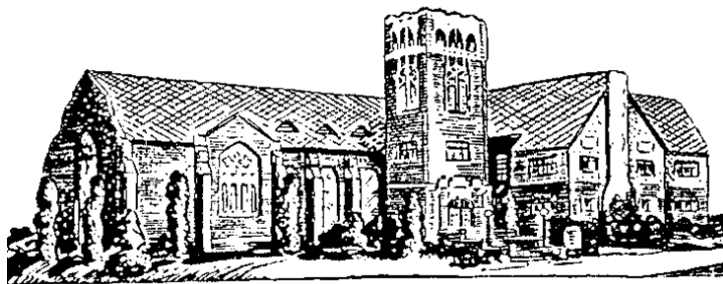

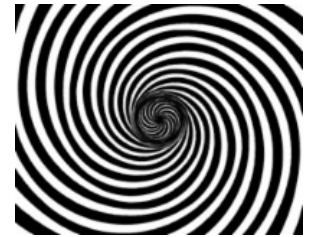
Finding Voice

Financial Matters

Faith In Action Teams

July 2017 General Fund Income: \$75,251.52
July 2017 General Fund Expenses: \$44,120.78

In the last Newsletter, I reported that as of June 30, 2017, we had a deficit of **(\$28,275.52)**. I also noted that my forecast for calendar year 2017 showed that we would have a **deficit** of about (\$31,000) by December 31, 2017. I based this forecast on the income received as of that date, plus a one-time receipt from the Foundation of around \$33,500. I expected to see the Foundation monies sometime in July.

We received the Foundation money in July, taking us from the above noted deficit, to a **momentary** surplus. The total income from the Foundation was \$33,500. This meant that at the end of July, we are showing a surplus of \$2,342.22.

In the last newsletter I asked members of this church to look closely at their finances and if possible, to increase their contributions to help with this deficit. Pastor Barbara made a similar request in a letter a short while later.

A number of very generous persons have come forward and made additional contributions towards reducing the deficit, for which I thank you very much.

At time of this writing, the additional donations total \$9,125. Based on these additional receipts, I would now amend my forecast to show a **deficit** for 2017 of about **(\$22,000)**. We still need help to reduce the deficit further.

Again, my heartfelt thanks to those generous persons who have helped, or are about to help with the deficit.

Environmental Care

Remember that sense of excitement you experienced as a child at the prospect of “going on a field trip”?! Well, the Environmental Care Team is offering you an opportunity to “relive those thrilling days of yesteryear”!

On **Saturday, Sept. 16**, the young and the young-at-heart will gather in the north parking area for a short trip to Talking Water Gardens in Albany. We will leave at **9:00 am** and return by noon.

Talking Water Gardens is an engineered water treatment wetland that reduces the water temperature before the water is returned to the Willamette River. Hundreds of native plant species have been planted in the gardens to provide habitat for over 100 species of birds and waterfowl as well as many small mammals.

We will be walking about 0.5 miles on a hardened trail. The trip will be led by Ron Leonard, a relatively new member at FUMC with 5 years of experience guiding in the West Eugene wetlands.

Bring clothing appropriate to the weather, comfortable walking shoes, sun screen, water bottle, and curiosity!

Member Contributes Perpetual Funding to FUMC

Rhonda Mast, who many of you know and who passed away in February, continues to provide funding to First United Methodist Church of Corvallis – and will provide it in perpetuity. She provides this funding through a gift to our foundation – the Corvallis United Methodist Foundation (CUMF). She arranged for this gift of more than \$10,000 by naming CUMF as one of the beneficiaries of an IRA. The CUMF Board is very appreciative of Rhonda's, and her family's, gift, as well as those of others, whose generosity and foresight has created an endowment that annually provides a significant amount of funds (in the past three years averaging about \$37,000 per year) to help meet FUMC's budget and mission needs. It is also of note that the CUMF funds are all invested in a socially responsible balanced portfolio. Sign up Genius: Why and How

WHY? Sign up genius makes it super easy to schedule volunteers. After you sign up, it sends a notice to the event organizer, so they can send you any extra information you might need. And the “genius” even sends you an automatic reminder a day or two before the event. If there is a change, the event coordinator can contact everyone who is signed up (eliminates lots of phone tag time!).

HOW? Go to sign up genius or click on a link in the newsletter or on the church website. If you go to the website you will have to find the specific sign up by knowing the creator’s name. Clicking on a link is much easier! Once you are at the right sign up, you just click on the button that says “sign up.” You will be asked to set up an account, which will make it super easy to sign up again. Make your password easy to remember, (this is a very low risk site), and sign away.
