# Random Musings from Pastor Barbara

As I write, the season of Lent is well underway. We have offered the imposition of ashes to those who appreciate the deep experience of fully acknowledging our mortality. Rev. Leslie Chartier helped us reflect on the wilderness – making time for personal reflection. We've tucked the church's most joyful word away in a box until Easter morning. We have begun asking ourselves and each other meaningful questions. We have a Lenten study about Jesus underway and I am teaching the Enneagam (a tool for self-reflection) on March 3<sup>rd</sup>. Some folks have established daily spiritual practices during these forty days. Lent is a pretty serious season, focused on introspection and mortality. I highly recommend turning ourselves over to it.

But did you know that all the Sundays in Lent are considered to be tiny "Easters?" Christians are urged to take a break on Sundays from deep introspection and have a Sabbath. This year during Lent, our Sundays have many moments of joy and celebration. We welcomed four new members into the congregation on February 25<sup>th</sup>. We celebrate communion on March 4<sup>th</sup>. We take some special moments for laughter and play during worship on March 11<sup>th</sup> (Rev. Sharon Tuck is preaching – I will be there as well) and we go see some of our youth in West Side Story that afternoon. To top it off, we are baptizing four children on the 18<sup>th</sup>. What a joy!

I love how our awareness of life's limits and fragility can actually make times of delight all the more powerful and poignant. It would be marvelous if we could walk in this truth all the time – deeply appreciating the beauty life offers while being mindful that life is brief. I know when I pay attention in this way, I make different, more intentional choices about how to use my time and where to place my attention. Lenten practice is good LIFE practice.

I remind you that on March 25<sup>th</sup> (Palm/Passion Sunday) we journey through Holy week to the cross and drape the sanctuary in black, covering all symbols and signs of hope. Remember that you are invited to share supper in the Martha Room on Holy Thursday (5:30 p.m.) and immerse yourself on Good Friday evening in music that evokes the cross (7:00 p.m.). I hope you will make a point of participating that week. It is what makes the joy of Easter (April 1) ring true and carry deep meaning.

I am glad to be with you through it all!

# Order a New Church Logo Shirt





#### **Environmental Care**

Did you know that educating girls in developing countries can lead to reversing climate change?

The climate action book *Drawdown*, edited by Paul Hawken is a compendium of many ways to reverse climate change, ranked according to the amount of greenhouse gases they avoid or remove

from the atmosphere. Idea #6 *Drawdown*'s list of effectiveness is to educate girls around the world. Educating girls has a dramatic effect on the number of children they have when they become adults. Women with more years of schooling have fewer and healthier children, and they manage their own reproductive health.

Educated girls also earn higher wages and experience higher upward mobility. They are more empowered at home, at work, and in society. Additionally, women are often managers of food, soil, trees, and water. As climate change continues, educated women can observe, understand, evaluate and take action to sustain themselves and their communities.

Girls around the world have met with many challenges when they try to get an education:

- economic barriers not enough money for tuition or uniforms,
- ♦ traditional beliefs boys should be educated first, or that marriage should occur at a young age,
- cultural beliefs girls should be trained to tend the home/children,
- safety issues if the school is farther from home.

Today, 62 million girls are denied the right to attend school. Changing that will help change their lives as well as the future of our each. To learn more about this issue please read *Half the Sky* by Nicholas Kristoff or visit www.Malala.org.


